

# What is BCASW?

- BCASW is a voluntary, not-for-profit membership association
- Supports and promotes the profession of social work and advocates for social justice
- Incorporated in 1956
- Over 1,500 members including students and retired social workers

### Educators, Practitioners, & Regulators

- Separate and distinct from the profession's regulatory body, the BC College of Social Workers
- The revised Social Workers Act established the BCCSW in 2008
- Ontario, PEI, Alberta, BC have an association and a college

### What We Do


- Promote awareness of our varied roles




